## The Importance of Stewardship

The Gospel (Mt.21:33-43), as scholars generally point out, presents allegorically in summary form the history of salvation. The landowner is God, and the vineyard is the people of Israel with their privileged position as chosen people (Is 5:1-7) The tenants are the religious and political leaders who reject and maltreat the servants, the prophets sent by God again and again. The son of the vineyard owner is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. He is the stone that the builders rejected that has become the cornerstone.

**The parable highlights the importance of stewardship.** The punishment that comes from the treacherous tenants is a consequence of their failure to acknowledge that they are stewards, not owners of the vineyard. Stewardship is being entrusted with the care of something. It always entails accountability. This is described in terms of "producing the fruits" for the owner of the vineyard.

Throughout the parable, there is an emphasis on the importance of producing or bearing fruit. This applies also to relationships among people. Once relationship ceases to be fruitful, it begins to die. This is also true of discipleship. **Once the follower of Jesus stops yielding the "good fruit" the Lord expects, the person ceases to be a disciple and steward.**

Aside from their failure to bear good fruits, the wicked tenants fail in stewardship. They are guilty of coveting what rightly belongs to the owner of the vineyard. When the wicked tenants failed to deliver, the vineyard is taken away from them and is leased to "other tenants who will give him the produce at a proper times. **At the end, it is the kingdom of God that is given to a "people that will produce its fruit.**

The **Middle School Ministry** is here to develop, evangelize, grow and journey along with our children to have a more deeper closer relationship with God and to enrich them of knowledge and understanding of our Catholic Faith. MSM or also called EDGE Nights is a part of Youth Ministry but works with the grade levels from 6 to 8 (Middle Schoolers). **EDGE Nights are on Thursday nights at the Pastoral Center from 6:30PM to 8:00PM.**

EDGE Nights the children are guided by Core Team Leaders of the Youth Ministry through opening prayer and gathering, Ice Breaker activities, a Video Presentation, Proclamation Testimonies, Small Group faith sharing/reflection, and Sending off challenges with a Closing prayer. Core Team Leaders follow a lesson format from a resource called Lifeteen Catholic Youth Ministry. The EDGE Nights lessons under the Lifeteen Catholic Youth Ministry are particularly made for Middle Schoolers grades 6 thru 8. The Catechetical Lessons can be topics of Issues or Social subjects that middle schoolers are able to relate with and/or have been expose to through past and current events as witnessed or seen in their daily lives such as in local, US or World News. With Social Media through internet and TV, these generation of children are very expose to such topics everyday. The children are also gathered on EDGE Nights to break bread with each other where they are not only Spiritually feed but all come together to sit at the table and be fed a nutritious dinner provided by the Core Team Leaders. Parents do not have to worry of their children being hungry and missing dinner on a Thursday night.



Parents are encouraged to bring their middle schoolers on Thursday nights to the Pastoral Center if their child's schedule does not conflict with other school or family activities. It could also be a good night for Parents to have a break from their child to do errands or have a Date night with each other knowing their child are in a safe environment and occupied enriching their Catholic Faith with their fellow peers. If Parents are free and do not have anything planned for themselves on Thursday nights, they can also be involved with support and behind the scenes to help with the Middle School Ministry in other areas such as preparing the meals to set up before they break bread at the table while waiting for their child to finish the



night. The Middle Schoolers will participate and also be involved in Community Projects and outreach services as part of their Middle School Ministry and will be combined with their fellow High Schoolers in Youth Ministry. Although EDGE nights are emphasized on catechetical lessons on Thursday nights, the children also have Social Nights once a month on the fourth Thursday of each month with a fun activity, fellowship and potluck.

Currently as-of-to date on EDGE nights we average of 15-20 middle schoolers on a weekly basis on Thursdays. It is such a great pleasure to see how the Holy Spirit touches these young Middle Schoolers on Thursday nights. The children continue to grow and show such great enthusiasm and emphasis with questions on wanting to know more of their Catholic Faith in a comfortable setting and surrounding environment among their fellow peers. It amazes how these children are hungry for spiritual feeding and building their deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. I continue to invite, encourage and challenge all parents of the Co-Cathedral of St Theresa families to bring your children on Thursday nights to the Pastoral Center at 6:30PM for EDGE Nights with Middle School Ministry. Also your child can bring a guest and/or their school friends as well to be a part of EDGE nights. **Our doors are always Open to any child who wants to share in fellowship and get to know who Jesus Christ Our Savior is as a Friend they can have a closer and deeper relationship with.**

# ADDITIONAL INFORMATION OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA



**The Fatima mystery has intrigued Catholics and non-Catholics alike for a century.** It all began on May 13, 1917, when three cousins, aged 7-10, reported they had seen a vision of the Virgin Mary as they grazed their sheep. They went to the same spot in coming months and reported similar visions.

Initially, the Portuguese Church officials and many people doubted them. However, many doubters became believers after the so-called "miracle of the sun" on October 13, 1917. The children had predicted that the Virgin would perform a miracle that day and thousands of people flocked to Fatima and saw what witnesses reported was a vision of the sun "spinning" in the sky and zigzagging toward Earth.

**Fatima, Portugal (1917)** While tending sheep in a field called the Cova de Ina, Lucia de Santos and her two cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto, reported six apparitions of Mary, who identified herself as "Our Lady of the Rosary." Mary urged prayer of the rosary, penance for the conversion of sinners and consecration of Russia to her Immaculate Heart. The following is a timeline of the apparitions of Mary:



- May 13, 1917** Three shepherd children, Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco see a ball of light near an oak tree and when they approached, the light was a beautiful lady. She said she was from Heaven and that she wishes the children to come to the Cova on the 13<sup>th</sup> of the month of the 6 months.
- June 13, 1917** Our Lady appears for the second time to the children who came despite their parent's wishes for them to attend the St. Anthony Festival
- July 13, 1917** Lucia's mother decides to join the 30,000 on lookers at the Cova. They are told that a devotion to the Immaculate Heart would bring more souls to salvation. They were given three secrets: a vision of Hell, the consecration of Russia, and a papal assassination. Lucia turned pale and cried out with fear, calling Our Lady by name. There was a thunderclap, and the vision ended.
- Aug 13, 1917** The fourth apparition does not occur as planned due to the kidnapping of the children by an anti-Church civil administrator.
- Aug 19, 1917** The children see Our Lady for the fourth time and she speaks of the need for penance for one's sins and those of the world.
- Sep 13, 1917** A crowd of 30,000 witnesses the sun dim at noon and then a globe of light descending on the oak tree. White roses are seen falling from the sky and the witnesses are reminded of the importance of praying the rosary to end the war. They are told St. Joseph and the child Jesus will accompany her at the October apparition.
- Oct 13, 1917** Our Lady appears to the children for the sixth time. She identified herself as "Our Lady of the Rosary" and the famous dance of the sun took place, witnessed by a crowd of 70,000 people. Numerous witnesses – some as far as 40 miles away – reported seeing the sun dance, spin and send out colored rays of light.

Job 19:7 Behold, I cry out, "Violence" but I am not answered; I call for help, but there is no justice.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Notice that it says "awareness" month. Our community, our Church, our clergy and parish leaders, we all need to grow to more quickly recognize that there are victims of domestic violence close by - in our circles of influence. Victims and perpetrators are members of our Church, the Body of Christ!

The World Health Organization in 2013 reported that 35 percent of women around the globe have experienced sexual or physical abuse. And according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control, 25% of our men are or also have been victims.

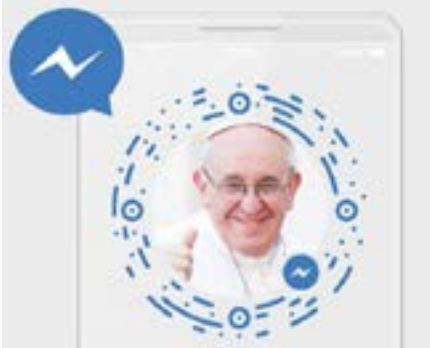

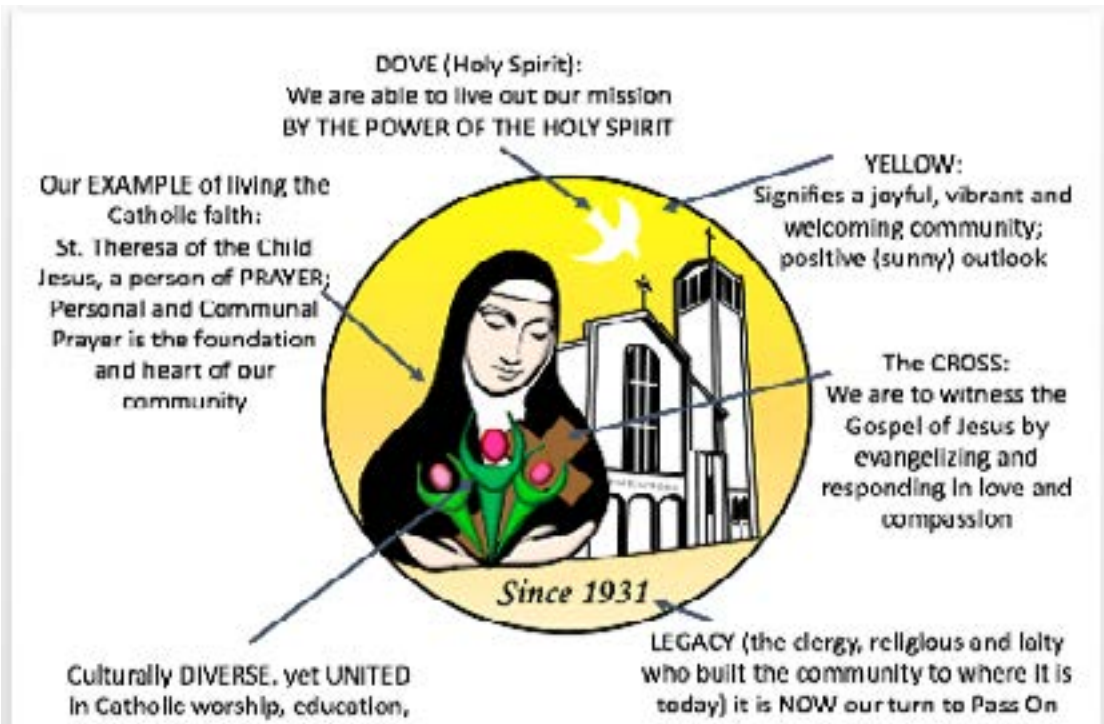
