RALLYING FOR LIFE AT MARCH FOR LIFE ON FRIDAY, JAN 20 AT HAWAII STATE CAPITOL

In today's Gospel, Jesus begins his Sermon on the Mount with a series of blessings, the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes are a summary of the fundamental attitude of a Christian steward.

"The Beatitudes teach us the final end to which God calls us: the Kingdom, the vision of God, participation in the divine nature, eternal life, filiation, rest in God" (CCC 1726). As the Catechism summarizes, "The Beatitudes confront us with decisive choices concerning earthly goods; they purify our hearts in order to teach us to love God above all things" (1728).

Beatitude, then, is a gift we are promised that requires cooperation on our parts. This brings together the two ways a person can be blessed: (1) by what is given to us by others and (2) by what we receive by our own choices and actions. God is ready to give us Beatitude with our cooperation.

This means we must stop doing certain things and start doing certain things. The things we must avoid are evil-doings, including our worship of wealth, resort to violence, vainglory, lying, and so on. The things we should do are all good deeds, done humbly and with gratitude.

If we turn to Zephaniah's prophecy in the first reading (Zep 2:3;3:12-13) into the form of Christ's beatitudes, we could say: Blessed are those who observe God's law; blessed are those who seek justice; blessed are those who seek humility; blessed are those who do no wrong; blessed are those who tell no lies; for they shall be sheltered from God's wrath.

Thus, the Beatitudes teach that happiness really consists in the possession of God. And living them transforms us into persons who are like God.

Human trafficking is modern-day slavery and involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act. Millions of men, women and children are trafficked into forced labor situations and lured into the sex trade worldwide. Many of these victims are lured from their homes with false promises of well-paying jobs; instead they are forced or coerced into prostitution, domestic servitude, or other types of forced labor. Trafficking is exploitation-based and victims can be any age, race, gender or nationality. Trafficking victims can be men, women, young or old, American or from abroad, with or without legal status.



In solidarity with those suffering from this exploitation, our Church calls for us to be thoughtful of the victims of human trafficking and pray for them. Through prayer, we not only reflect on the experiences of those that have suffered through this affront to human dignity, but also comfort, strengthen, and help empower survivors.

There are many ways to begin to share our faith. You could invite someone to Mass, engage in an intellectual discussion, or go see a Christian movie.

However, sharing your story is one of the most powerful starting points. Your faith story is precious; God can and will use your story as an instrument of salvation in another.

Pope Francis encourages us, "Today, there is a kind of preaching which falls to each of us as a daily responsibility. It has to do with bringing the Gospel to the people we meet, whether they be our neighbors or complete strangers.

This is the informal preaching which takes place in the middle of a conversation. Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others and this can happen unexpectedly and in any place: on the street, in a city square, during work, on a journey. This is a personal dialogue, when the other speaks and shares his or her joys, hopes and concerns for loved ones or so many other heartfelt needs. (Evangeliium Gaudium, n. 127).

The Gospel means little unless it has changed one person. Your personal story makes the facts of salvation concrete, real, specific and personal. Tips on sharing your story next week!

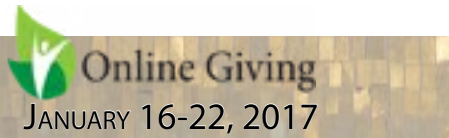
